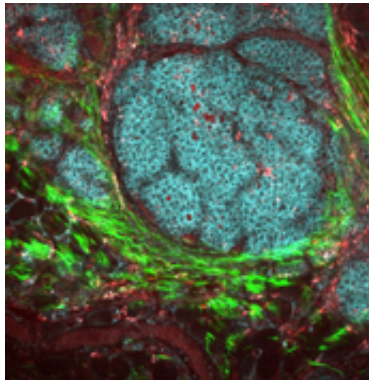

A new study reveals breast cancer cells devour their own waste to fuel tumor growth. The discovery could lead to new therapies.

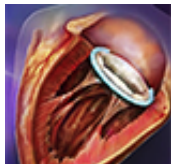
